By Law

Article I. - Name

1. This organization shall be called the Libyan Internet Society

Article II. - Purpose

The purposes of the Libyan Internet Society are as follows:

1. To promote education, research and applications of Internet technology and related matters.
2. To disseminate Internet knowledge to executives and staff in governmental agencies, governmental enterprises, and private companies, as well as the general public, students and all other parties interested in computer networking.
3. To exchange knowledge and experience about Internet with organizations and learned societies both in Libya and abroad.
4. The Libyan Internet Society will serve persons who live or work in the state of Libya.
5. The Libyan Internet Society is not a political organization and will not engage in political activities.

Article III. - Membership

1. For participation in activities of the society , membership is not necessary, but preferable.
2. All individuals and organizations falling within the defined scope of the society shall be eligible for membership without discrimination.

Article IV. - Officers

1. The officers of this Society shall be: Chair, Vice Chair , Treasurer and Secretary General, The term of office of the officers is Four years. If the Chair resigns, the Vice Chair becomes the Chair and the position of the Vice Chair is vacant. When an officer position is vacant, the Chair appoints a member to serve the remaining term of the position.
2. The officers shall be elected at the annual Business meeting. They shall take office immediately upon election and serve until their successor is elected.

Article V. - Duties of Officers

1. The Chair is the principal officer and is responsible for leading the Society and managing its activities. The Chair shall preside at all meetings of this Society and of its Executive Council. With the advice of the Society's Executive Council, the Chair shall appoint all members of committees of this Society and all Committee chairpersons.
2. The Vice Chair shall preside at meetings in the absence of the Chair.
3. The Secretary General shall keep the minutes of all Society's and Executive Council meetings.

Other duties of the Secretary include:

A) Preparation of the Annual Society Report for presentation at the Annual Business Meeting.

B) Preparation of the Society 's Activity Report

4. The Treasurer shall collect dues, pay all bills, and maintain the Society's financial records. Duties of the Treasurer shall also include:

A) Preparation of the Society Annual Financial Report for presentation at the Annual Business meeting.

Article VI. - Executive Council

The Executive Council shall consist of the present Society officers, the immediate Past Chair, the chairpersons of the Society's standing committees and upto 30 Members-at-Large. The term of the members of the Council shall coincide with the terms of the officers. They shall take office on the first day of the fiscal year and serve for two years.

Article VII. - Standing Committees

1. The Standing Committees of the Society shall be Seminar and Exhibition, Membership, Technical, Publication, and Publicity.
2. The Seminar and Exhibition Committee shall plan and make arrangements for the technical programs of the Society's seminars and exhibitions in accordance with the membership's interests
3. The Membership Committee shall plan membership drives and keep records of membership.
4. The Technical Committee shall be in charge of technical matters.
5. The Publication Committee shall be in charge of publication
6. The Publicity Committee shall be in charge of the Society's publicity.

Article VIII. - Temporary Committees

1. With the advice of the Society Executive Council, the Chair may appoint such temporary committees as appropriate.
2. A Nominating Committee, consisting of at least three members of this Society, at least two of whom shall not be members of the Executive Council, shall be appointed by the Society Chair at least two months prior to the Election meeting.
3. An Audit Committee shall be appointed by the Society Chair at the close of the fiscal year to assure the accuracy of the accounting of the Society funds for the year. This Committee should also verify the accuracy of the Financial Report prepared by the Treasurer.

Article IX. - Meetings

1. The Society shall hold meetings only in places that are open and accessible to all members of the Society. Meetings shall be held as planned by the Seminar and Exhibition Committee.
2. The Annual Business meeting shall be held at the last meeting of the program year. At this meeting, the Secretary-General and Treasurer each shall present a report. Also, the election of officers shall be held.
3. Notices of the place and time of all meetings shall be distributed to all members at least one week prior to any meeting, by Internet mail or by oral, telegraphic, or other written notice, duly served on or mailed

Article X. - Disbursements and Dues

1. Disbursements from the Treasury for Society expenditures shall be made by the Treasurer with authorization of the Executive Council and shall be included in the minutes of its meetings.
2. Dues shall be fixed annually by the Executive Council.

Article XI. - Amendment and Voting Procedures

1. No official business of the Society shall be conducted unless a quorum of the Society is present.
2. A quorum of the Society shall be defined as 20 percent of the voting membership of the Society or 50 members, whichever is greater.
3. A simple majority of the members present and voting shall be required to carry a motion.

4. Officers will be elected by a plurality of votes cast. If the election is conducted by mail ballot, 20 percent of the voting membership of the Society or 50 members, whichever is greater, must be returned to have constituted a quorum.

Article XII. - Dissolution of the Society

1. Dissolution of this Society by consent of the members shall consist of unanimous agreement of all its officers together with a majority vote at a meeting which has been publicized in advance to all members of the Society for the purpose of taking this vote.

2. Should this Society be dissolved, its assets shall be transferred to Assumption University within three months after having been dissolved.
