ICANN 75 Update

ICANN75 was the first hybrid Annual General Meeting held at Kuala Lumpur from 17-22 September. It was attended by ,165 in person and 792 remotely from 112 countries.

Apart from welcome ceremony, there were plenaries on : Q&A with ICANN Org Executive Team, Internet Fragmentation, the DNS, and ICANN; Public Forum, 24th AGM and Community Recognition and Updates on Geopolitical, Legislative, and Regulatory Developments; there were cross community sessions; capacity building and technical sessions and internal work and policy sessions of the SOs/ACs

At Large Engagement @ICANN 75

ICANN75 was ICANN's Annual General Meeting and, as noted above, was already filled with activities of interest ICANN wide. Outreach featured in our At-Large programme with APRALO starting the week by introducing a group of Malaysian university students to ICANN and At-Large via a number of APRALO-coordinated sessions. Many thanks to Suhaidi Hassan and the APRALO Leadership Team for this brilliant programme.

During a GAC Training session, Australian counterparts, Cheryl Langdon Orr and Ian Sheldon explained how At-Large and the GAC can work together in their communities in the interest of common goals. We later met with the GAC formally to discuss policy issues and this session like others truly demonstrated the success of the hybrid model with GAC Liaison Joanna Kulesza moderating it from her home in Poland.

We also engaged in policy discussions with the SSAC and the GNSO. Both these sessions offered lively and productive inputs from remote as well as in-person participants which we hope will continue in future meetings. This was our first session with the GNSO for a long time, and many thanks to Justine Chew for her leadership as the ALAC's GNSO Liaison. APRALO also featured as leads in other sessions with Justine, Lianna Galstyan and Satish Babu involved in a session on IDNs and Holly Raiche co-leading the Operations, Finance and Budget WG update.

The ICANN plenary focused on the fragmentation of the internet and other policy issues within the CPWG were updated by co-Chairs Jonathan Zuck and Olivier Crépin-Leblond. They followed up with a discussion with the ICANN Board about how the Board considers and actions policy ADVICE from the ALAC. At the end of an exhausting meeting and having completed four demanding years as the Chair of the ALAC, I gratefully passed the baton on to my colleague, Jonathan Zuck.

I thank you all for your support during my term as Chair and am already enjoying my new role as Vice Chair with responsibility for At-Large Outreach and Engagement.

APRALO Activities @ICANN 75

As the host RALO of the ICANN75, APRALO organized several important activities. ICANN75 therefore marks a post-pandemic return of ICANN meetings to the region, although it was organized under appropriate COVID-19 protocols.

APRALO hosted two RALO Coordination sessions, one focussing on policy aspects such as GDPR and Diversity (Saturday, 17 Sep 2022), and the other focusing on leadership transition and continuity, as well as outreach and engagement (Tuesday, 20 Sep 2022).

APRALO organized an outreach program targeting students from universities in Malaysia, in order to get them to be interested in ICANN and its activities. About 38 students and some of their faculty spent Tuesday, 20 Sep 2022, in different ICANN meetings, starting off with a briefing at 09:00. The program was supported by Suhaidi Hassan, Ameena and Asyraf.

Also on the same day, APRALO organized a 75-min session titled "Celebrating diversity for an Inclusive Future", which combined APRALO's regular monthly meeting with an interactive session that included Akinori Maemura, an ICANN Board member, Jia-Rong and his team from GSE Singapore, ICANN75 Fellows, ICANN75 NextGen members, and the local students who joined the meeting for the day.

This meeting was held in two parts, with the first part looking at the history of APRALO, as well as APRALO Regional Policy Priorities arrived at through a survey conducted within the community. The second part was meant for interactions, and this section started off with Akinori Maemura delivering an opening address, followed by the APAC GSE Team led by Jia-Rong and Save Vocea, followed by an introduction to DotAsia and NetMission by Pavel. The session also had a quick presentation from the different ALSes and Individual members from the APRALO community.

On the final day of the conference, the community leaders who were leaving their leadership positions--which included Maureen, Holly, Cheryl, Satish, Lianna and Amrita from APRALO--were felicitated by ICANN.

Overall, ICANN75 was a very productive meeting for APRALO as the host RALO.

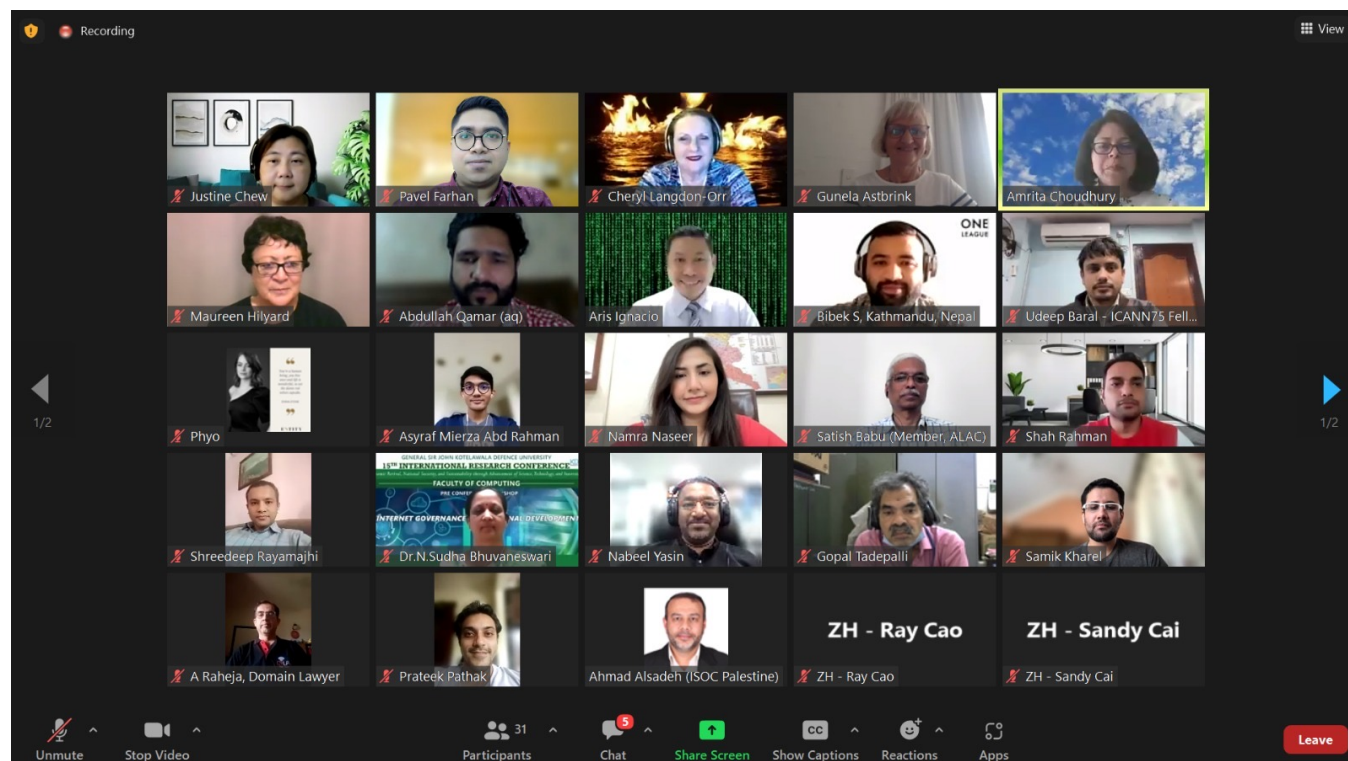
APRALO Monthly Call Updates

APRALO Policy Forum:

The APRALO Policy Forum has had a very productive year 2022, having delivered 4 key events and the APRALO Regional Hot Topics Survey 2022 project in the last 6 months.

Since its key planning meeting of 13 May 2022, the team had implemented its Fireside Chat Program by running its Inaugural [Fireside Chat on GNSO PDP 3.0](#) on 26 May with Cheryl Langdon-Orr and myself, followed by the (2nd) [Fireside Chat on Closed Generics](#) with Holly Raiche and Olivier Crépin-Leblond on 8 June; and the (3rd) [Fireside Chat on Transfer Policy](#) with Steinar Grøtterød and Jonathan Zuck on 29 June; all of which were very well-received by participants. During ICANN75 in Kuala Lumpur, the team also delivered on 19 September, the **At-Large Policy Session: ICANN's Goal for a Multilingual Internet through Internationalized Domain Names (IDNs)** featuring ICANN Board Member Edmon Chung, ICANN org's Sarmad Hussain and (then) ALAC Vice Chair for Policy Jonathan Zuck. In this session, Jonathan shared some preliminary end-user demand perceptions on the availability and usability of IDNs in the Devanagari script from the recent limited end user survey which the At-Large conducted with selected Hindi-speaking communities in India. 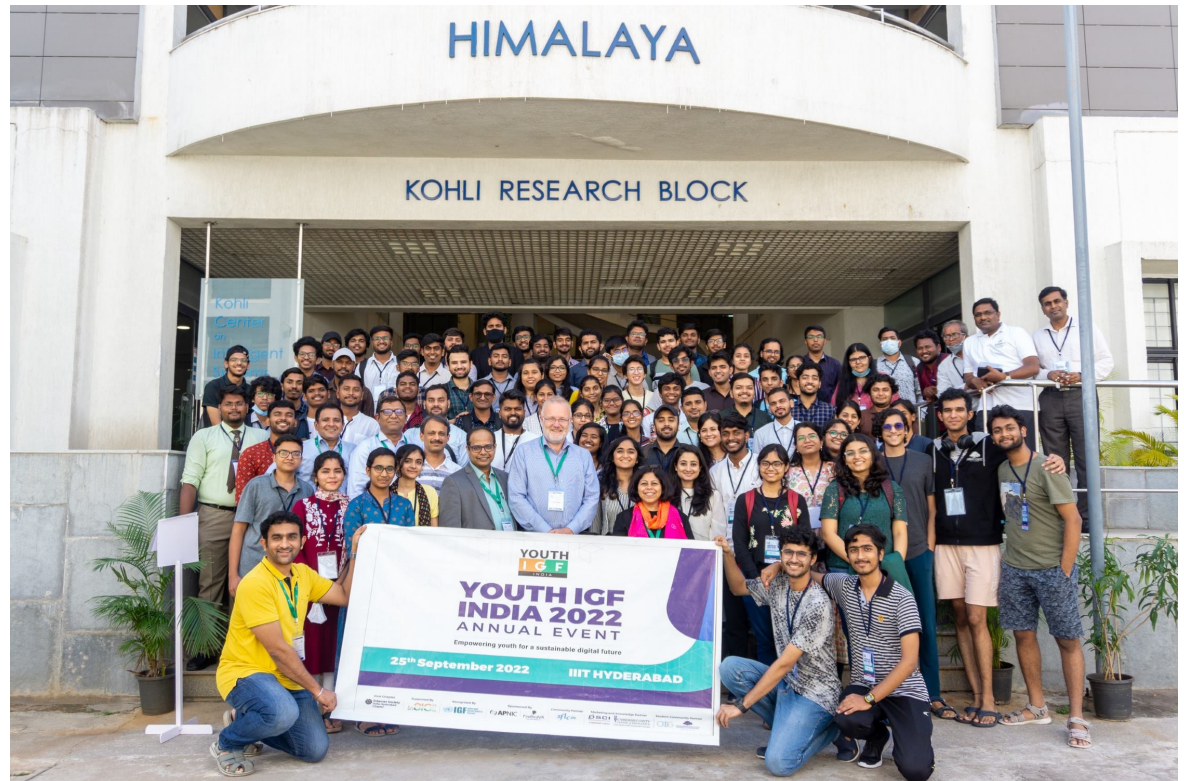
Update from Our ALSes: 5th Edition of Youth India IGF2022

On September 25th, the 5th edition of the annual [Youth IGF India](#) was organised at IIIT-Hyderabad under the theme “Empowering youth for a sustainable digital future”. The forum had 110+ youth including 12 fellows. The event provided an opportunity for the youth to interact with like-minded people on various critical issues, such as digital inclusion, cybersecurity, emerging technologies and regulations, censorship, data governance, and opportunities for the youth.

Maarten Botterman(ICANN Board) and Anja Gengo (UNIGF), Dr. Bhagwan Chowdhry, Osama Manzar (DEF), Narendra Nath (National Security Council Secretariat), Dr. Sriram Birudavolu (DSCI), Rama Devi Lanka (Emerging Technologies, Government of Telangana), Amrita Choudhury (CCAOI), Satish Babu (ALAC ICANN), Anupam Agrawal (IIFON), and Srinivas Chendi (APNIC) spoke at the event. There were workshops, keynotes, panel discussions, and interactive classroom sessions.

Youth India IGF till now has facilitated in empowering 2000+ youth from across the country in the last 5 years.

Update from Our ALSes: 8th Pakistan School on Internet Governance (pkSIG)

pkSIG came back with a bang in 2022 to hold a physical event after two consecutive virtual schools between 11-13 October. pkSIG kept up with its tradition of conducting the school in a different city each year, with the beautiful city of Muzaffarabad, AJK as the newest destination. More than 60 participants attended the school out of which 33% were female students where 06 Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) were also selected. 08 fellowships were granted to the residents of AJK including 2 PWDs.

The school was held in the Pear Continental Hotel, Muzaffarabad with kind sponsorship by Larus Foundation, Pacific Connect Ltd, Special Communication Organization, Meta, Google, APASA and ICANN whereas support was provided by Inspire Mill, AJK IT Board. The school is organized by a group of volunteers, headed by Parvez Iftikhar, International ICT Consultant whereas Secretariat is managed by PTA and Internet Society Pakistan Islamabad Chapter. The primarily young audience included people from Government, academia, civil society, legal and private sector background. The Programme featured lectures/discussions covering latest topics on Internet Governance presented by speakers from PTA, ICANN, Meta, Google, SCO, Larus Foundation, FIA and others. Ms. Midhat Shahzad Secretary IT & Information, Government of AJK graced the opening ceremony whereas Mr. Muhammad Iqbal, Special Assistant to the Prime Minister AJK on IT presided over the closing ceremony and distributed shields/certificates among participants. Now that all provincial capitals in Pakistan are served, we take on another challenge next year to conduct the school in Gilgit, located at foot of the second highest mountain of the world i.e. K-2.
