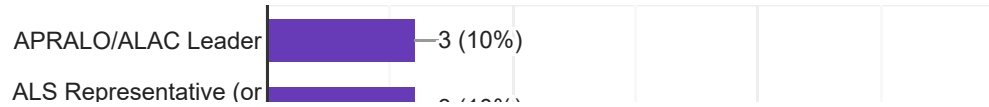

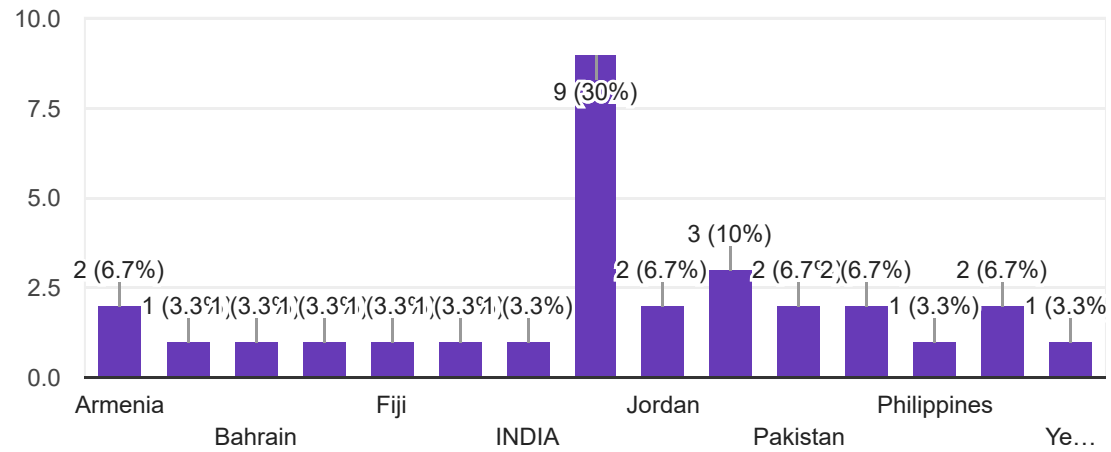

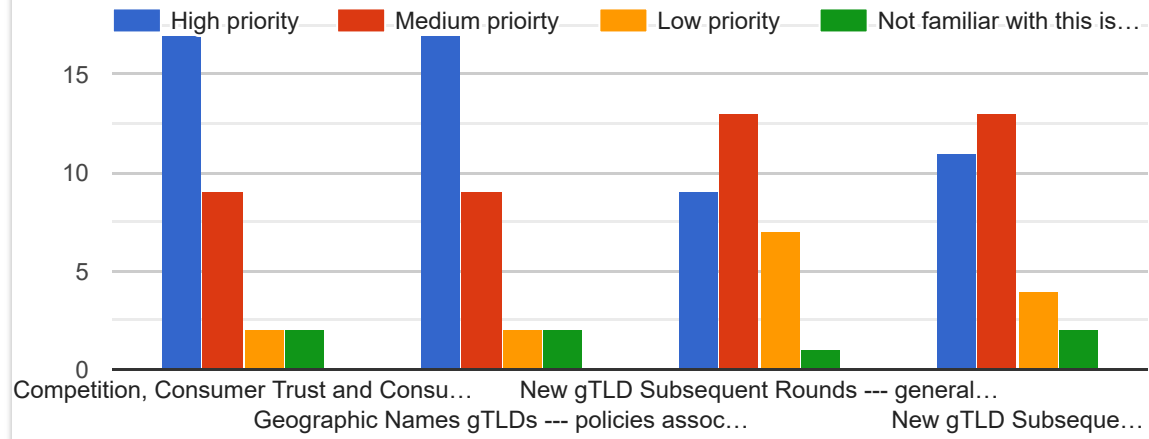


Country of residence or location of your ALS:

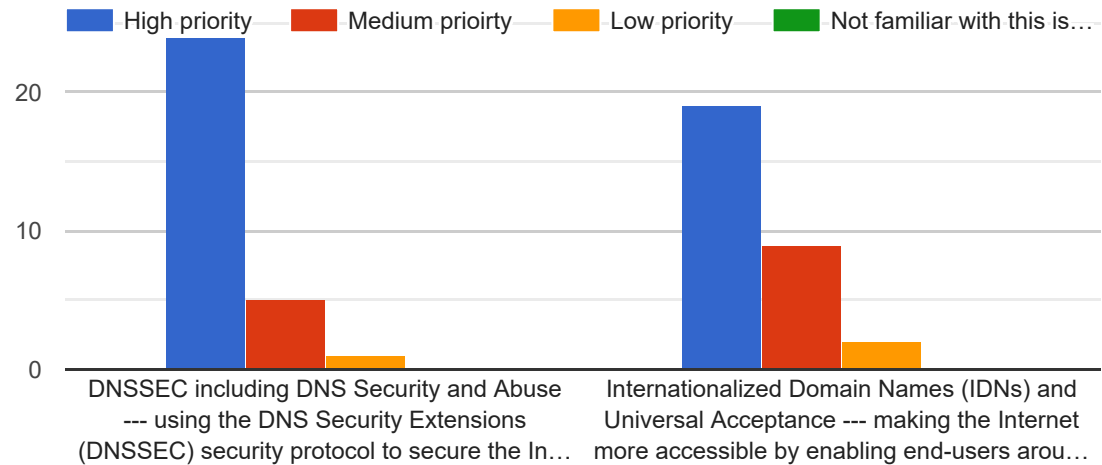

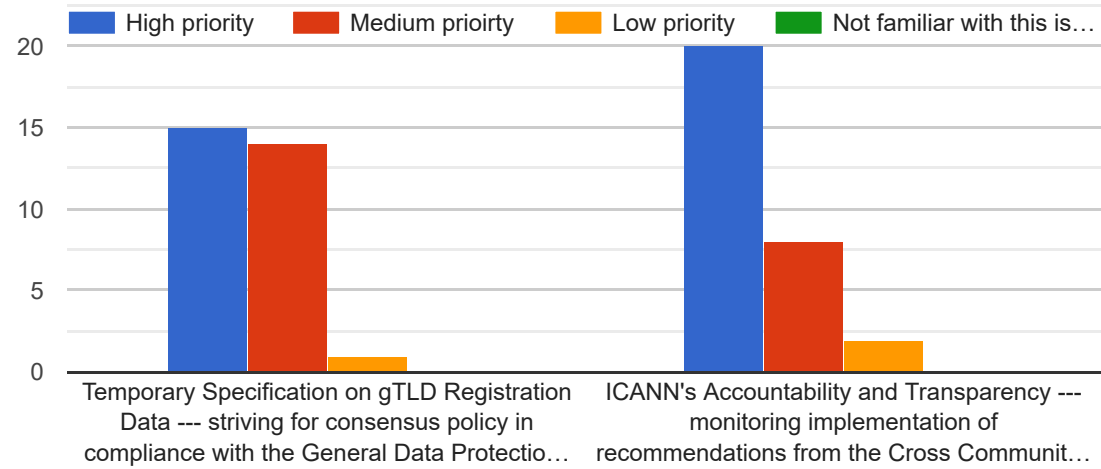
ICANN Policy priorities relevant to APRALO
