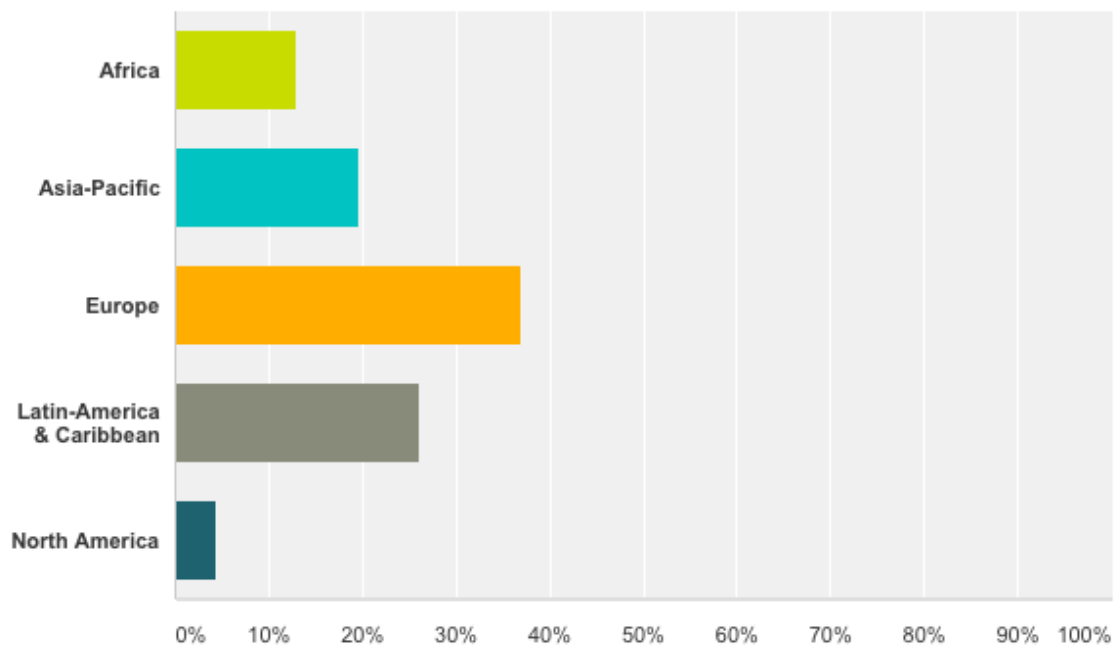
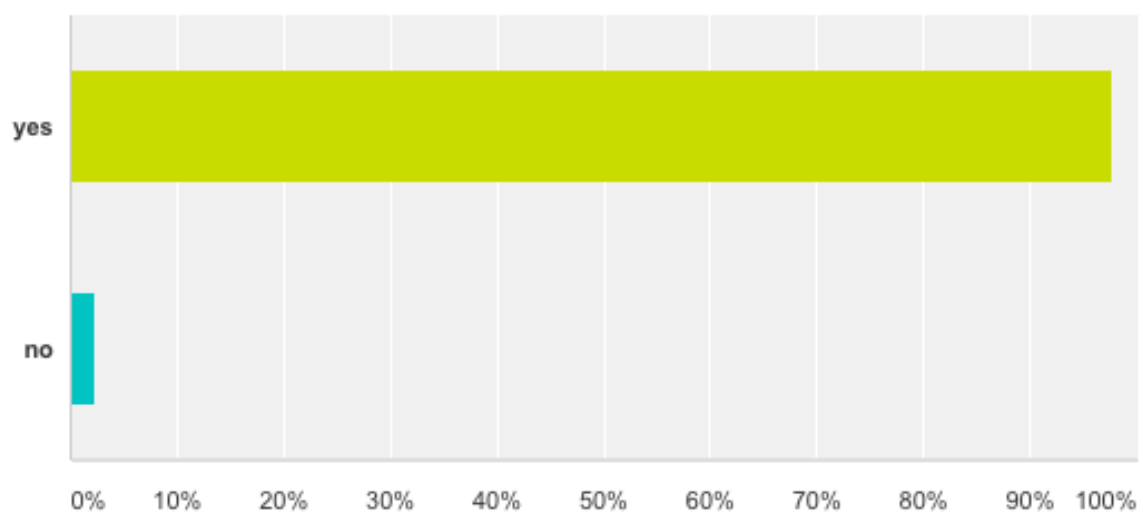

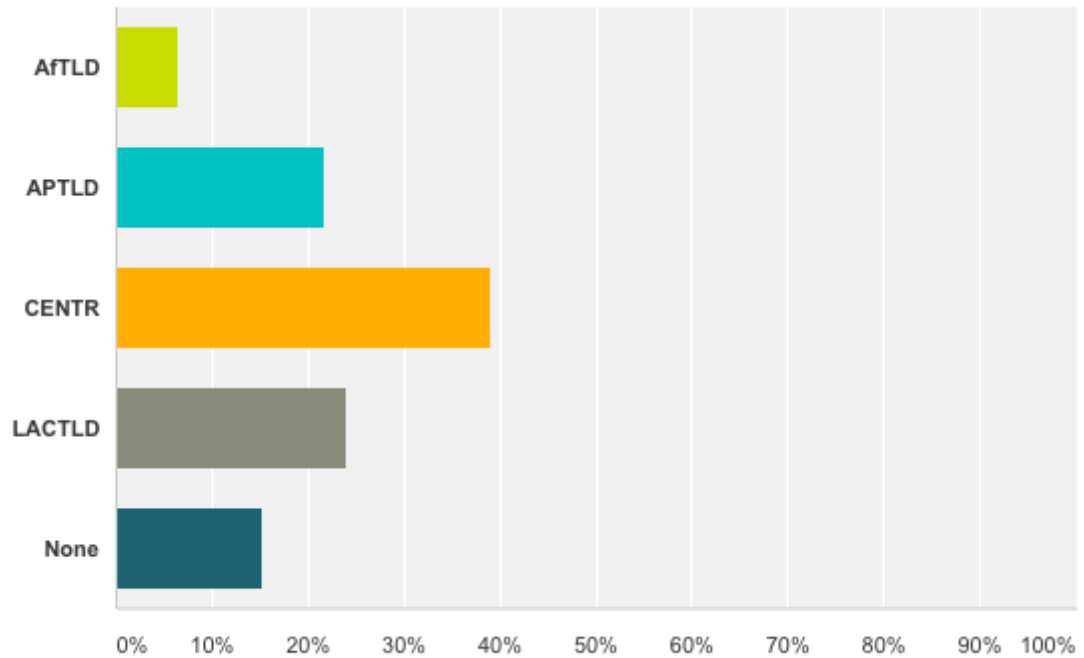
Q1. Which region does your ccTLD belong to?



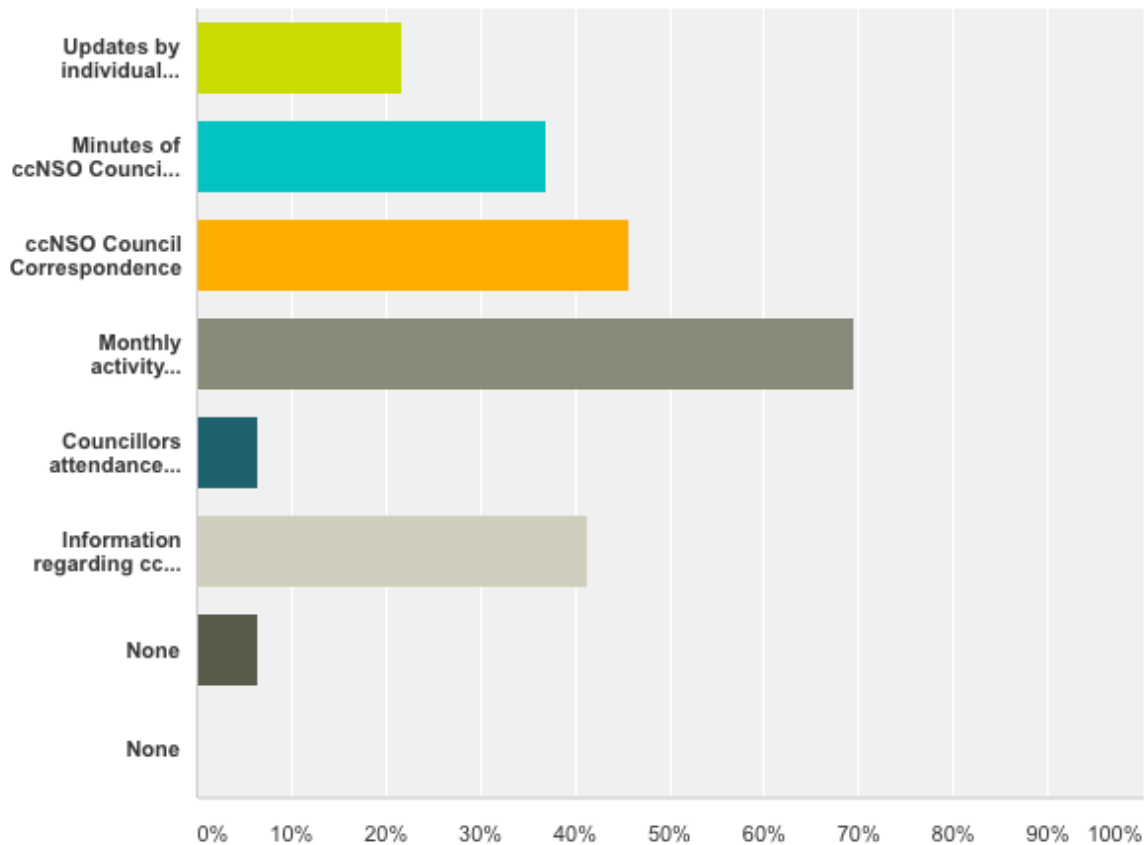
Q2. Is your ccTLD a member of the ccNSO?



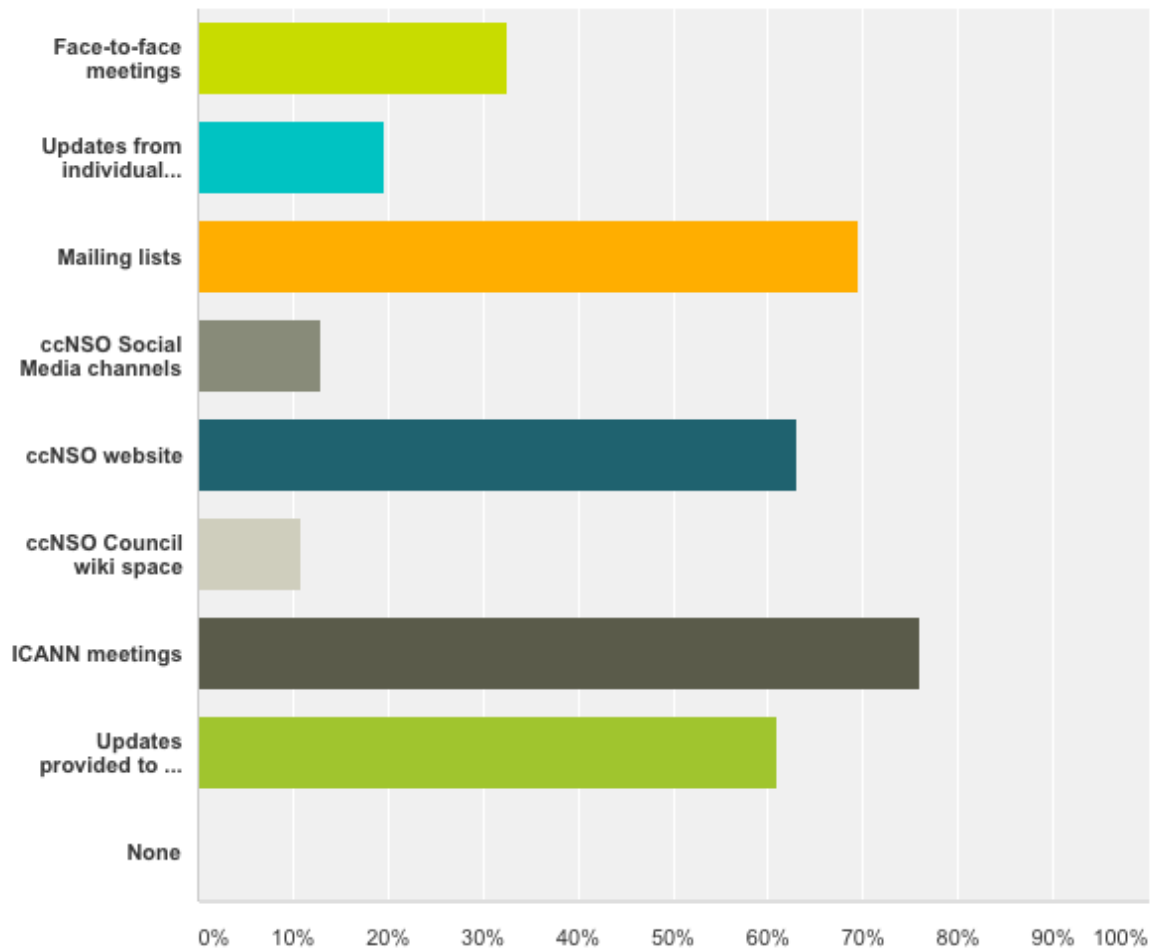
Q3. Is your ccTLD a member of a Regional Organisation? Select all that apply.



Q4. Which information do you use to stay informed about the activities of the ccNSO Council?

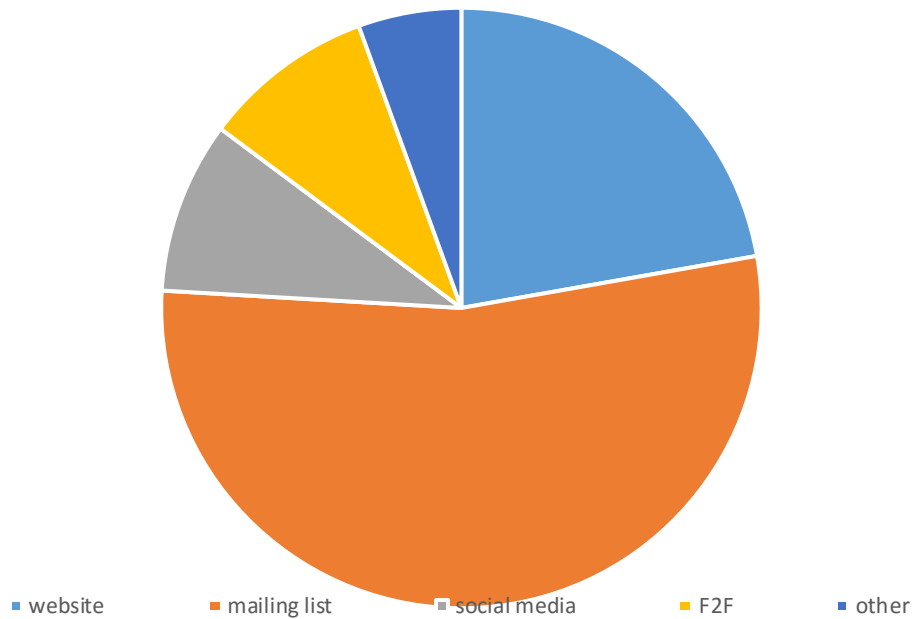


Q5. Where do you look for information about the activities of the ccNSO Council?

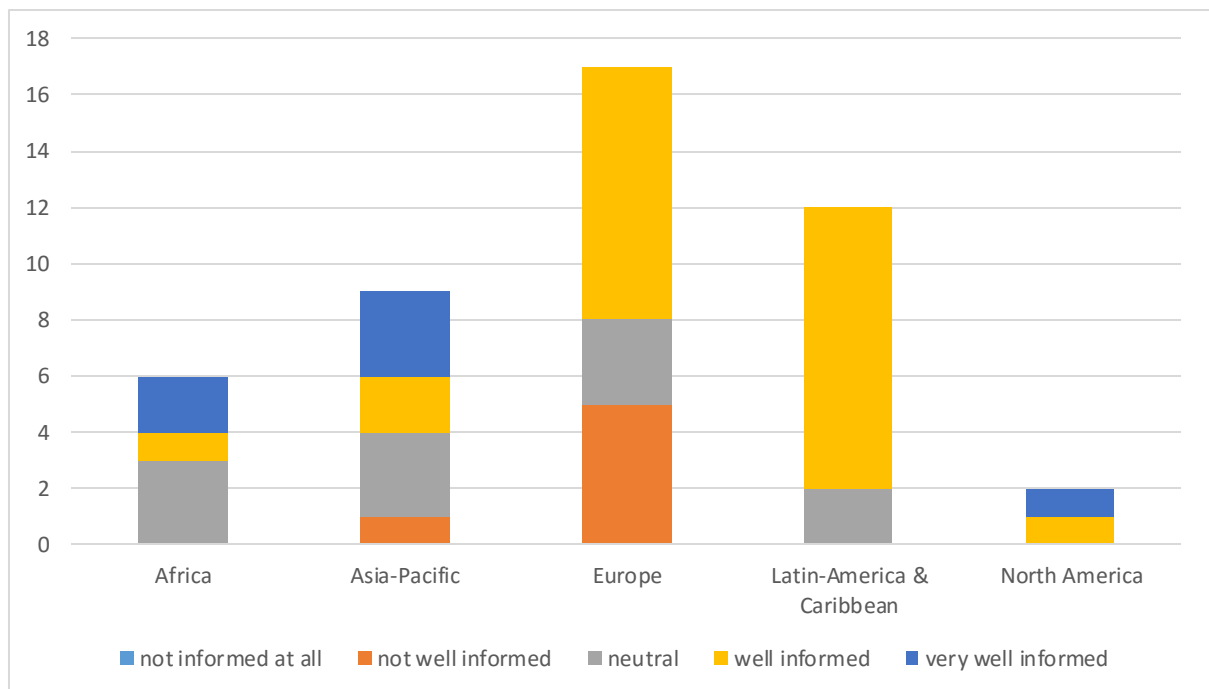
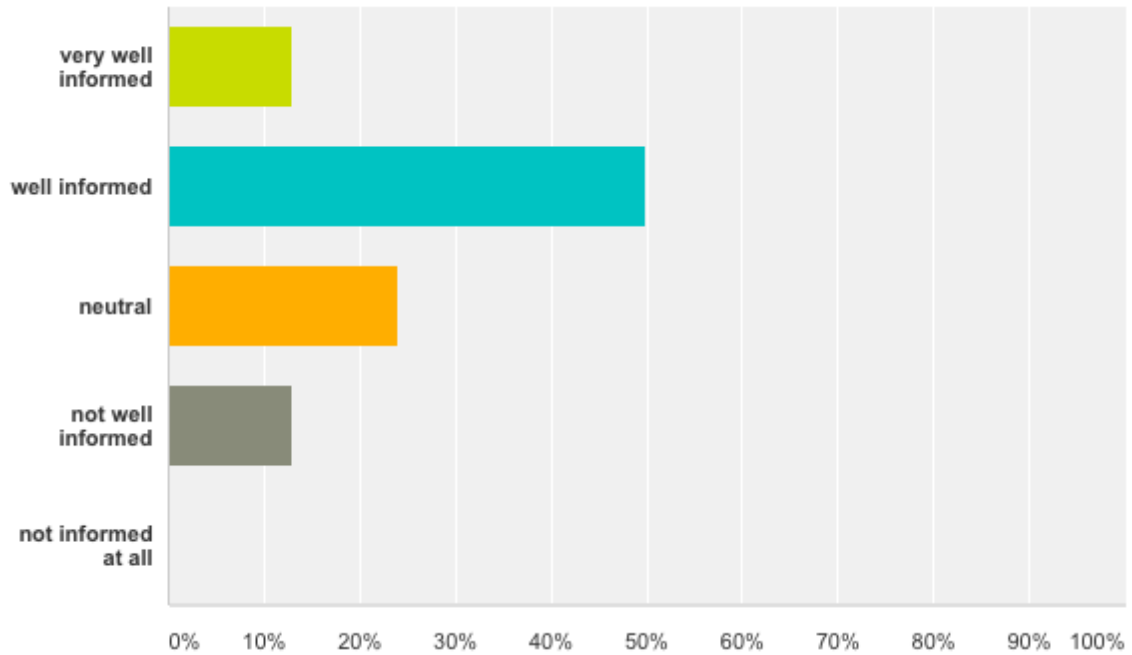


Q6. What would be your preferred method to learn about the activities and decisions of the ccNSO Council?

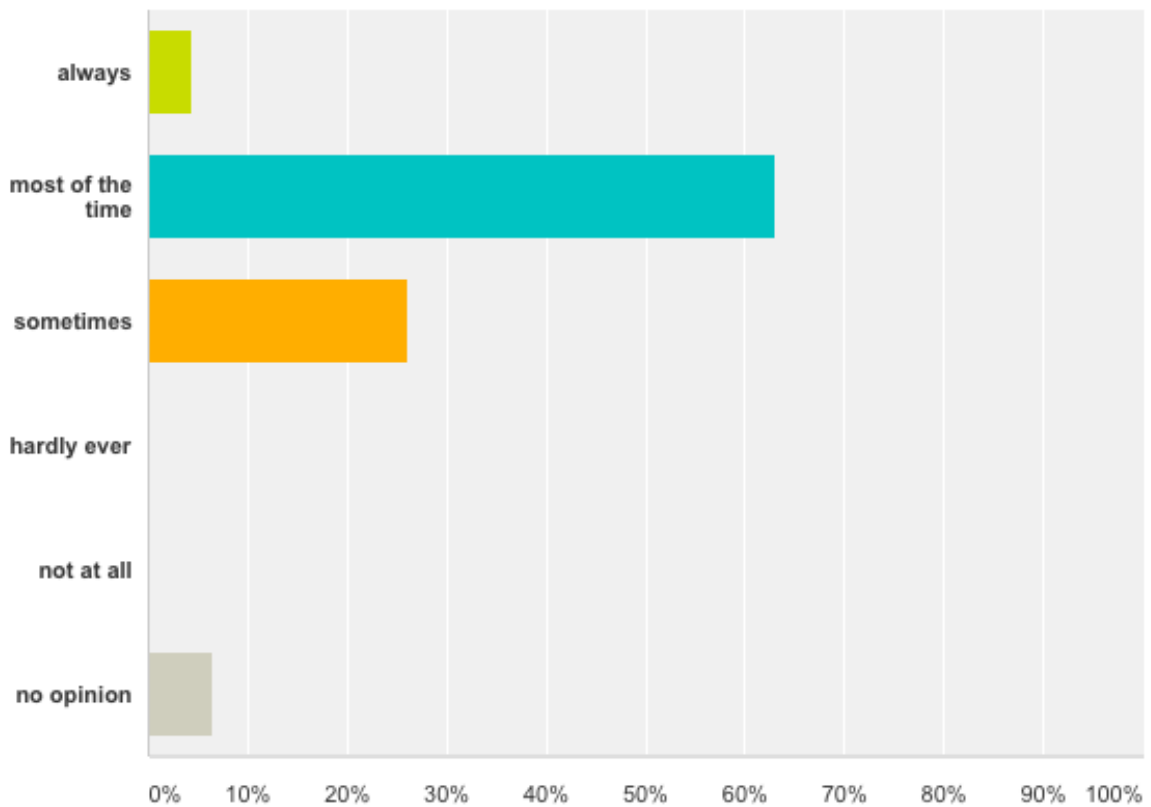

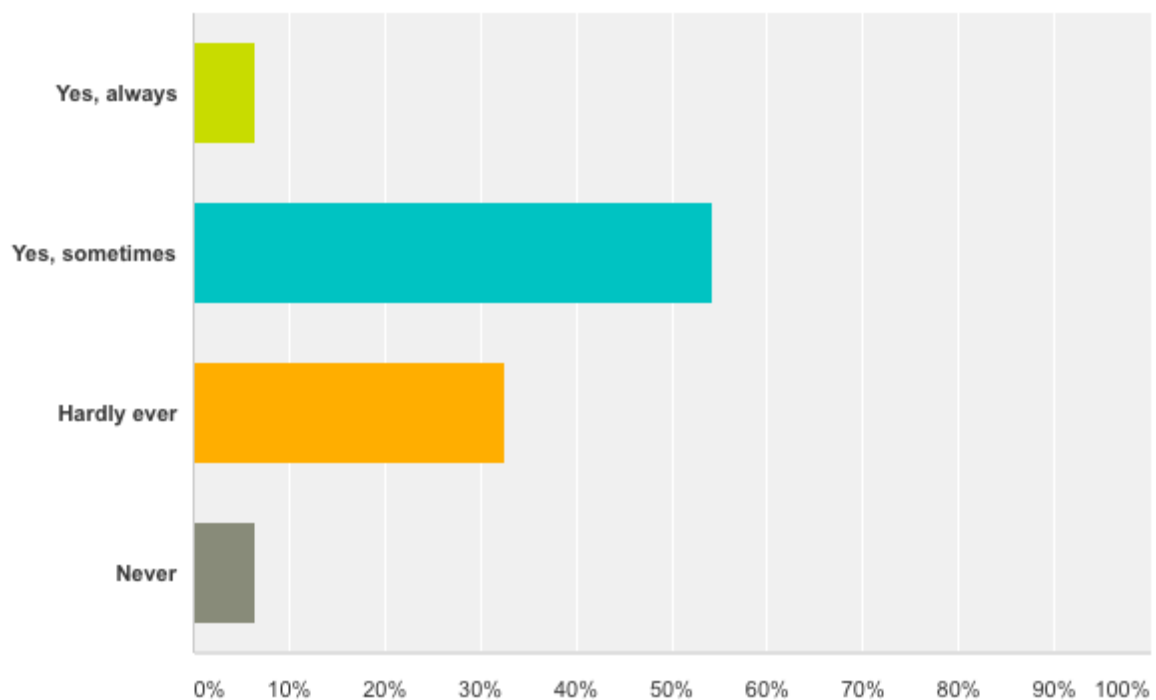
Q7. Overall, how well do you consider yourself to be informed about the ccNSO Council activities?



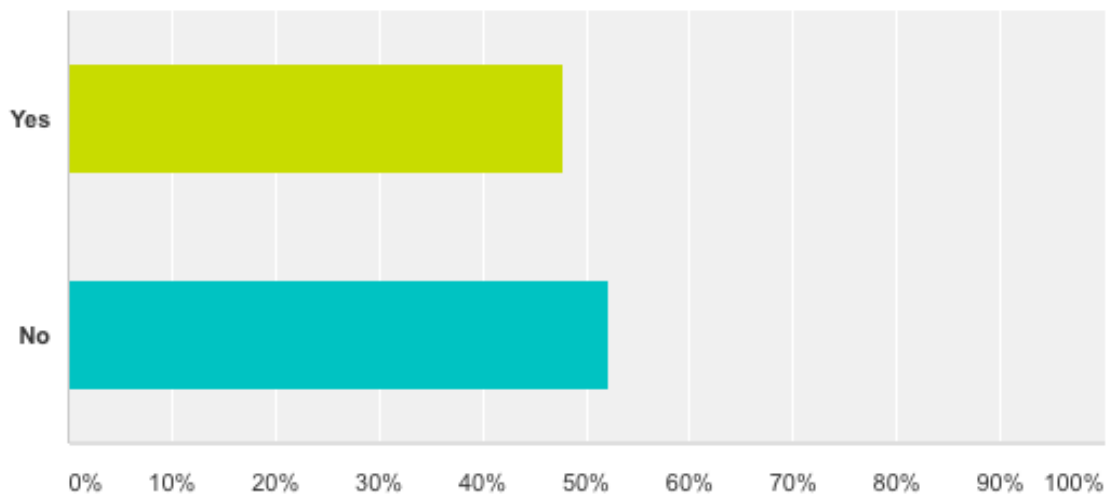
Q8. Does, in your opinion, the ccNSO Council welcome input from the community and explain its decisions and activities?



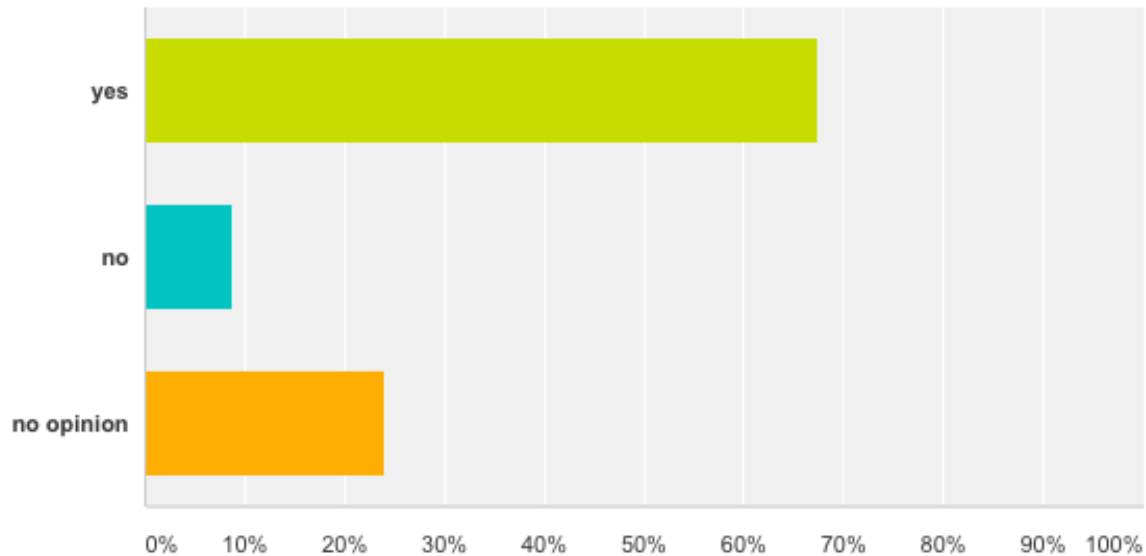
