## DEAR EURALO AND COMMUNITY MEMBERS!

We welcome you in 2026 and we are sure that the year has started intensively and at the right working pace.

On behalf of the Euralo Chair and EURALO Board, leadership, I would like to briefly highlight our plan, recent achievements and intentions:

We have **approved EURALO criteria for the [CROP](#)** and suggest you (Euralo members, Individual or ALS representatives) **to use the opportunity** and **apply** (kindly ask you review the criteria and all related information).

Note: 1 of the three slots will be used to attend ICANN86, which will be held this fiscal year in Europe (Spain). Same work on establishing criterias for Discretinary Fundings have started.

We thank Pari Esfandiari for **the conducted audit of the existing basic documents**, identified the current links and relationship between RALO-At-Large-ALAC-ICANN. We will use this information to start working on gray areas as soon as possible and work out (or clarify) the basic principles of interaction, distribution of rights, duties and responsibilities of key roles in EURALO and beyond.

In active participation, collaboration with EURALO Board and with support of GSE Europe we began **establishing/updating contacts with existing and potential ALS** and individuals on the ground. There is one of the next step in mobilizing the community and attracting experts from different professional fields for the ICANN Policy, tech Internet governance work and community development processes.

Simone Catania, EURALO Board member, has take important commitments to **strengthen Euralo's digital presence on Social Media** and will oversee this task. EURALO initiated to discuss during Mumbai meeting the CIP results and will propose to the At-Large community a draft list of issues defining the matrix of relations, rules, and principles of operation of RALO-At-Large-ALAC-ICANN, which in our point of view require **revision and elaboration**.

We intend **to develop recommendations for the community to improve the process of reviewing applications** from individuals or ALS for membership to ensure transparency of the process, strengthen the opinion of the RALO in decision-making and accelerate the review of applications.

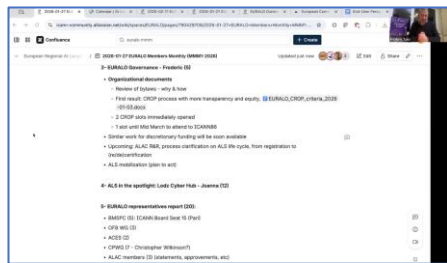

This is the first time that an ICANN Public Meeting will be held in Seville (ICANN63 was held in Barcelona in 2018). ## Announcement of At-Large Slate of Candidates for Seat 15 of the ICANN Board - sent 16 January 2026

Dear All,

On behalf of the At-Large Board Candidate Evaluation Committee (BCEC), and in accordance with the agreed schedule for the At-Large Board Member Selection Timeline, we are pleased to announce the slate of candidates for consideration in filling Seat #15 of the ICANN Board. These candidates have passed the initial BCEC evaluation and were approved on its call of Thursday, 15 January 2026.

The BCEC met 15 times and undertook a comprehensive review of all submitted Expressions of Interest, applying a weighted scoring methodology that incorporated both core mandatory criteria and qualitative assessments. Each applicant participated in a 45-minute interview covering topical, situational, and personal dimensions. All candidates deemed suitable for the slate successfully completed the ICANN Due Diligence Process.

On Wednesday 21 January a meeting took place among ICANN stakeholders based in Vienna at the Central European University (CEU). The meeting was in two parts, the first one to present ICANN and its different stakeholders to the University students, the second one to have a more detailed discussion among stakeholders.

In the first part Gabriella Schitteck (ICANN) summarized the history of the Internet from its invention to the creation of ICANN, then described the structure of ICANN and its functions and challenges, including Internet fragmentation and emergent technologies. The session continued with a mention of the different ways for students to be involved, and ended with Q&A. Among the questions, one was about content regulation, which required a clarification about the limited mandate that ICANN has.

The second session opened with the participants introducing themselves, mentioning how they became active in ICANN and what is their role in the organization.

The first question asked by the moderator was what were the challenges they saw. Answers included some problems or delays in providing services by ICANN, the need to bring new faces - including younger people. It was mentioned that programmes like NextGen are a great way to get new people exposed to ICANN, but the question is how to best retain them and solicit active contribution.

The discussion continues addressing more issues. Universal Acceptance, as well as standardisation in general and multilingualism in the Internet, was mentioned.

The role of Governments has been discussed, observing that sometimes local regulations could affect the smooth functioning of the Internet - Internet fragmentation was mentioned.

The questions by the students addressed mostly international politics, like EU influence in the work of ICANN, and the role of ICANN with other international organization.

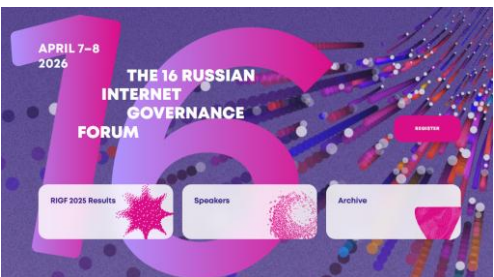

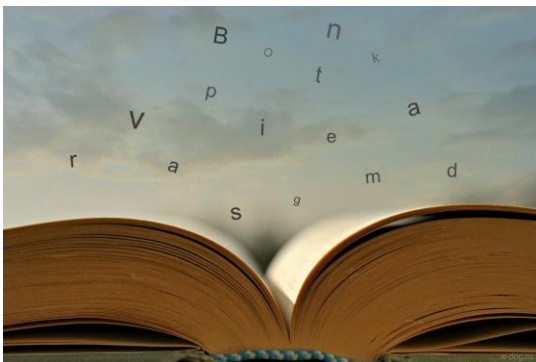
